





Supports for Children with Autism in Child Care Settings

Presented by Oregon Program Autism Training Sites & Support Staff and Family Connections of Lane and Douglas Counties

This two session training opportunity will provide child care staff with a greater understanding of working with children with autism enrolled at their center or home. Topics discussed for Session 1 will include learning characteristics, and simple activities to encourage social and language skill development. Session 2 will focus on behavioral strategies. This workshop will provide specific examples of evidence-based practices that can be implemented immediately in the child care setting.

Participants may register for one or both sessions. Both classes are Set 1 in the Oregon Registry with 2.5 hours in Special Needs. The age group is infant/toddler and preschool.

Who Should Attend:

Child care center providers, registered family child care providers, certified family child care providers, teachers, assistants and other staff providing services to children with Autism Spectrum Disorders.
